

Background to the Proposals



Healthcare is constantly evolving, and it is right that we continue to look at ways to optimise the operation of our hospitals to ensure services are being delivered as efficiently as possible.

At present, many of Edgware Community Hospital's health and admin services are spread widely across the site. With many operating from dated and under-utilised buildings, the result is a patient experience with room for improvement and higher running costs.

To address this, in conjunction with local health officials we are proposing to consolidate some existing health and admin services into the main Hospital building and other buildings on the site, which would help address the aforementioned issues, and free up areas of surplus land for residential redevelopment to help fund the proposed relocation of services.

As a key, strategic community hospital, local health officials have stated they have no intention of downgrading or removing any health services which are currently provided on the site. The proposed changes are supported by the North London Sustainability and Transformation Partnership (STP) and the North Central London Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG).
